## **HIGHWAY SAFETY ISSUES**

#### WILDWOOD RD / JOHNSON ST. – INSTALLATION OF STOP SIGN REQUEST

A citizen's request by Mr. Frank Hammell was submitted requesting the installation of a stop sign at Wildwood Rd as it intersects with Johnson St. Mr. Hammell stated the intersection itself is very dark and there is no paint or lines on the street to give an indication when to stop. He went on to say that people have commented on almost getting hit or going right through the intersection. Chief Lewis stated that he would visit the area. Based on that visit, Chief Lewis indicated that the opposing streets do have signs installed and therefore would recommend the following; (1) that both ends of Wildwood Road as they intersect with Johnson St. have stop signs installed. (2) That additional stop signs be installed at; Robin Hood and Johnson, Robin Hood Rd. at West Shore Rd and on Woodvue Rd at the intersection of West Shore Rd. These were supported by the committee.

## PLAN REVIEWS

## 36 MARBLEHEAD ROAD - SIMPSON'S CROSSING/55+

Upon review and discussion regarding the proposed plans, the committee had the following questions / comments;

- 1. Committee questioned the line of site distance as it relates to the intersection of Lavender Rd and Marblehead Rd
- 2. The committee would support a road width of <u>no less than 24'</u> but would prefer to see road width of 28' in anticipation of future road acceptance by the town
- 3. Due to Age population and potential increase of Emergency Medical Services, the committee would encourage that Cul-de-Sac length(s) be limited to 1,200'
- 4. The committee also questioned as to whether or not consideration had been given to potential connectivity to Emerson Rd.



# 55 & 67 RANGE ROAD – GATEWAY PROJECT

The committee review Major Site Plan submitted by Karl Dubay. This project proposes to include; 55+ senior housing, offices, restaurants, commercial services as well as medical uses. Due to the magnitude of this proposed development, it was the committee's desire to meet with Mr. Dubay at a later date to discuss this further.
