Alternate Appointment

Vice-Chairman Skinner chaired the meeting in the absence of Mrs. Fallon and appointed Mr. Rouillard to replace Mr. Adams for this meeting.

Spruce Pond Estates, Dredge & Fill

Presented by Joe Maynard of Benchmark Engineering Location – Adjacent to NH Route 28 (Rockingham Road) Lots 3-B-600, 650, 1200, 1300

Mrs. Linowes asked that the Conservation Commission consider sending a letter to the Planning Board asking that the Commission be given time to review this plan. The Members reviewed the letter written by Mr. Anderson regarding Spruce Pond. Mr. Seniow motioned to accept the letter written to the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Service as written. Mrs. Linowes seconded the motion. Mr. Senibaldi, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Seniow, Mrs. Linowes and Mr. Rouillard voted not to accept the letter as written. Motion failed 0-5. The Members discussed the following:

- Drainage
- Mitigation beyond open space
- Concerns regarding the loss of wetland function
- Concerns regarding road width
- Add Best Management Practices to letter

Mr. Seniow motioned to accept the letter as amended. Mr. Senibaldi seconded the motion. Passed unanimously.

After listening to Mr. Maynard's presentation and discussing the areas of concern the Conservation Commission had the following recommendations:

- Area A (1,800 square feet) Drainage is a concern in this area. The Commission would like to see an investigation into alternatives to minimize rip rap.
- Area B (23,000 square feet) This is the largest wetland impact the Commission has ever seen. The Commission would like to see further mitigation including exploring wetland creation in proximity to the area of impact.
- Area C (450 square feet) The map of this area should be amended to include the full impacted area.
- Area D (40 square feet) No particular concerns.
- In areas A, B and C impact would be reduced by employing narrower road widths.

Hopkins Road

Presented by Joe Maynard of Benchmark Engineering

Mr. Maynard explained that he must go before the NH Department of Transportation before he can give more definitive information. Mr. Maynard will present the plan in great detail in the future. There was a discussion on the road link to Derry. Mr. Seniow asked if the Commission should make a strong statement to the Board of Selectmen asking them not to change a Class VI road to a Class V road if it is part of an active trail system. Mr. Maynard provided a preliminary environmental impact study and explained that the study gives a brief synopsis of what is proposed in the area and how it was looked at from the standpoint of relocating Hopkins Road outside the existing alignment. Mrs. Linowes motioned to write a letter to the Board of Selectmen stating that the Commission is opposed to Hopkins Road being upgraded from a Class VI to a Class V road and this will further fragment an existing forested area. Mr. Seniow seconded the motion. Mr. Rouillard and Mrs. Linowes voted to send the letter. Mr. Senibaldi, Mr. Seniow and Mr. Anderson voted not to send the letter. Motion failed 2-3. The Commission discussed both conventional and open space subdivisions. Mr. Senibaldi motioned to amend the letter so that the Selectmen know that there are alternative concerns if Hopkins Road is not approved mainly the Developer using a conventional rather than an open space subdivision which would require more Dredge & Fill permits on the other side of the railroad bed. Mrs. Linowes seconded the motion. Mr. Seniow read into the record a letter to the Board of Selectmen regarding Hopkins Road. Mrs. Linowes motioned to write a letter to the Board of Selectmen stating that the Commission is opposed to the Hopkins road upgrade from Class VI to Class V at this time due to additional fragmentation of undeveloped forested area and the loss of a public trail but the Commission understands there is the potential for greater environmental impact. Mr. Rouillard motioned at this time the Conservation Commission objects to the reclassification of Hopkins because of potential fragmenting of undeveloped forested lands. Mr. Senibaldi added to Mr. Rouillard's motion but be aware of the possibility of greater impact due to conventional subdivision to access the remaining lots at the end of the road. Mrs. Linowes seconded the motion. Mrs. Linowes, Mr. Senibaldi and Mr. Anderson voted for the motion. Mr. Rouillard and Mr. Seniow voted against the motion. Motion passed 3-2.

Miss Skinner granted a five-minute recess.

Miss Skinner called the meeting back to order.

Planning Board Report - Miss Skinner

The Planning Board voted not to approve the bridge connection for Castle Reach Phase III.

Miss Skinner advised the Commission that Mrs. Fallon resigned.

Election of Officers

Mr. Seniow nominated Mr. Anderson for Chairman. Miss Skinner seconded the nomination. Mr. Anderson nominated Mrs. Linowes for Chairman. Mrs. Linowes seconded the motion. Mr. Anderson elected 4-1-1.

Mr. Senibaldi nominated Mrs. Linowes for Vice-Chairman. Mr. Anderson seconded the nomination. Miss Skinner nominated Mr. Seniow for Vice-Chairman. Mr. Anderson seconded the nomination. Mrs. Linowes elected 4-2.

Mr. Rick Adams was elected Secretary of the Commission at the July 10, 2003 meeting.

Mrs. Fallon and the Commission Members reported on the site walk at 10 Woodvue Road for a seasonal floating dock. The Applicant was advised not to cut trees but could trim the trees. The dock would be built on the footing of a previous dock. The Applicant told the Members that attended the site walk that he would be launching from another dock. The Applicant submitted both a Seasonal Dock Notification form and an Expedited Dredge & Fill form to the DES. Mrs. Linowes reported that the Dredge & Fill form had not been signed by the Town Clerk and the abutters had not been notified therefore DES would be returning the application.
