HIGHWAY SAFETY MEETING - SEPTEMBER 2, 2004

On September 2, 2004, the Department Heads discussed the following requests for highway safety improvements and made the following recommendations.

<u>Attendance:</u> David Sullivan, Chief Bruce Moeckel, Al Barlow, Chief Don Messier, Al Turner, Rex Norman, and Jack McCartney. Pat Yatsevich was also in attendance. Meeting began at 11:00 am.

PLANNING BOARD PLANS:

Goodhue Road – 2 Lot Subdivision

The Committee reviewed conceptual plans for a new two lot subdivision located off of Goodhue Road. The lots involve both the Town of Windham as well as Derry, but has no road frontage in Windham.

Mr. Turner moved to indicate that the Committee has no issues related to highway safety regarding this proposal. Mr. Messier seconded. Passed unanimously.

HIGHWAY SAFETY ISSUES:

<u> Copps Hill Road –</u>

- The following request was received:
 - Installation of "Slow Children" signs
 - Lowering of Speed Limit to 20 MPH

Mr. Turner moved to recommend denial of the Slow Children sign but to lower the speed to 25 mph. Mr. McCartney seconded. Mr. Sullivan discussed the need to conduct a speed survey prior to recommending any changes in the speed limits. Mr. Turner and Mr. McCartney amended their motion and second as follows: to deny the "Slow Children" sign and to revisit the request to lower the speed limit after a speed survey had been conducted. Amended motion passed unanimously.

Marblehead Road –

- The following request was received:
 - Repaint double yellow lines on road and place additional speed limit signs.

Mr. McCartney advised the Committee that the road striping had already been completed as per the budget.

Mr. Moeckel moved to deny the request for additional speed limit signs. Mr. Turner seconded. Passed unanimously.

Mr. McCartney advised the Committee that a new larger 24" x 30" speed sign had recently been installed on the road.

Hardwood Road –

- The Committee received four requests to lower the speed limit to 25 mph and install "No Thru Trucking" signs.

A similar request for these measures was received by the Committee last month. Presently a speed survey is being conducted by the Police Department.

Mr. Turner moved to table this request pending the results of the survey. Mr. Barlow seconded. Passed unanimously.

<u>Road Priority Listing</u> – The Committee reviewed the status of its Road Priority Listing project. All final reports and data to be submitted to the Selectmen should be available by the end of September.

Mr. Barlow moved to adjourn. Mr. Messier seconded. Passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 12:30 am
