| MIXED RECYCLABLES | Glass containers (bottles/jars only) | Rinse & clean (remove caps!) | Hopper at door 3 | Ceramics; cookware; drinking glasses; light bulbs; mirror or window glass. All are trash |
| | Aluminum beverage cans, tin cans, empty dry paint cans and empty spray cans | Air-dry paint cans (rinse and dry others) | Hopper at door 3 | Hazardous waste, including paint |
| | Plastic (bottles/jugs only)   | Rinse, dry, remove sprayers/caps | Hopper at door 3 | All motor oil bottles; All tubs (margarine/yogurt); and plastics marked "3" (V), "4" (LDPE), "5" (PP), "6" (PS) and "7" (OTHER). All are trash. |
| SORTED RECYCLABLES | Used clothing/household textiles | Bagged, clean, dry | Door 2 right (in box) | Rags, rugs, and carpeting are trash. |
| | Newspaper w/normal Sunday inserts; computer paper; copy paper; white paper; junk mail; magazines; cereal boxes; phonebooks; other paperboard | Loose or tied (not in plastic or paper bags) | Door 4 | Juice boxes, milk cartons, carbon paper, foil-containing products, plastic bags, soap boxes, food, or waste soiled paper are trash. |
| | Corrugated cardboard; brown paper bags | Loose and flattened | Door 5 | Pizza boxes and oily boxes are trash. |
| | Computers/electronics | | Door 2 center | Televisions sets and computer monitors are trash. |
| | Prescription eyeglasses | In eyeglass cases | Marked "Lions" drop box | Non-prescription glasses. |
| | Motor oil; automotive oil filters; transmission fluid; brake fluid | In plastic containers | Door 2 left | Hazardous waste, anti-freeze, and gasoline. |
| | NiCad batteries | In plastic containers | Marked "NiCad" batteries | Flashlight batteries are trash. |
| SCRAP METAL AREA | Wet cell batteries (from autos, boats, motorcycles) | Loose | Battery bin in front of building | Dry cell batteries (from watches/flashlights/smoke detectors/toys) |
| | Scrap aluminum including pans, lawn chairs, BBQ's, door and window frames | Remove glass from aluminum windows | Aluminum bin in front of building | Aluminum cans, wood, chair webbing, glass, and lava rock |
| | Refrigerators, dehumidifiers, air conditioners | Remove doors, glass, and plastic shelving | Refrigerator bin in front of building | All other steel appliances should be placed in steel bin |
| | Propane cylinders | Full or empty, valves closed | On marked pallet | Helium/oxygen/acetylene and all other non-propane tanks |
| | Scrap steel including bicycles, stoves, stovepipes, ductwork, washers/dryers (<i>ask about chain link fence/banding strapping</i>) | Loose | Steel bin in front of building | Plastic/rubber/televisions are trash |
| TRASH | Tires | Loose | Tire bin | |
| | General trash and garbage, including rugs, furniture and television sets | Loose or bagged | Door 1 | Hazardous waste, metal products, yard waste, recyclables, construction debris |
