Selling Lot 20-D-2000, near Woodside South development. No decision made, it is conservation land, not recreation. It was going to be sold to pay for Moekel Pond and Spruce Ponds projects. Peter on endowment raising funds for Moekel pond, Carol is on Moekel Pond committee.

Archeologically sensitive area signs. Potentially could buy to put around sheep pen perimeter Lot 20-D-1600 Gage Lands. ID the historic element by name on the sign. Could ID the sites and make a map for the 275<sup>th</sup> for people to walk to.

Discussed historic sign for McIlvain cellar, and Osgood cellar. Walked with forestry to McIlvain, want to walk to Osgood now. Wendy to write minutes for the McIlvain Cellar Hole Forestry Committee walk workshop.

Guest Mimi Kolodziej discussed the Windham adopt-a-spot program. It is not like highway adopt-a-spot. Town does a few different areas of historic value. Not an official committee, just sign up to participate. Its goal is to put flowers in and tidy up spot; gardening and beautification.

Union Hall photos showing property without historic sign, and with sign installed, and close-up of sign.

Nesmith Museum taking bids to be purged of bats, mice, and bats. There is a bat house installed on the eave to the left of the front door. Bats are getting into the attic space. Bat house needs to be removed.

The town wants to use vinyl siding on the Community Development building. It was built in 1941. Rhino Shield like what is in pick-up truck beds, is an alternative. Carol is opposed to vinyl being used. Peter supports vinyl siding, the building is utilitarian and has little historic content. Wendy undecided and needs more information. Frank to invite Dave Paulson to come talk to us about how vinyl siding will be done, repairs done before sheathing, etc, before we vote yes or no to approve it.

Geological Sites: Joan submitted photos of the Kettle Hole on Kendall Pond Road and Londonderry Road junction. Joan submitted photos, potential for a sign. The Esker at Campbell Farm, Butterfields Rock, and the Moraine all have the potential for a geological importance sign. Perhaps we need a Geological list for town.
